






#### **Ground 2**


 "That was, I must say, a remarkable letter. I do not consider that it was fair or reasonable to say that the erroneous citations could easily be explained and then to refuse to explain them"








 "Worst of all, the assertion that the citations are merely cosmetic errors is a grossly unprofessional categorisation."




